- 1. The Kalends of January: Leneas. Festivity of the god Bacchus.
- 2. The Kalends of February: Feast of lights or torches. Feast of the goddess Ceres.
- 3. The Kalends of March: Quincuatros. Feast of the goddess Minerva.
- 4. The Kalends of April: Megalenses: feast of the Goddess Cybele.
- 5. The Kalends of May: Europe Day. Celebration of the Europe's rapture by Zeus.
- 6. The Kalends of June: Matrales. Festivities in honour of Mater Matuta.
- 7. The Kalends of July: Neptunalia. In honour of Neptune.
- 8. The Kalends of August: Festival of Diana.
- 9. The Kalends of September: Ides of September. The Nail Ceremony of the Nail and the Feast of Jupiter.
- 10.The Kalends of October: Thesmophoria. Dedicated to the goddess Ceres.
- 11. The Kalends of November: Mundus patet. Last day on which the door to the underworld was considered open.
- 12. The Calendas of December: The Saturnalia.

The aim of these visits is to attract and retain the loyalty of the local public, through the mythology and beliefs of ancient Rome. These are unique and unrepeatable visits.
