

ACTIVITIES. VILLA ANTIOPA.

1. GENERAL OBJECTIVES AND METHODOLOGY OF THE ACTIVITIES

The proposed didactic activities will be developed covering three thematic axes: art, archaeology and history.

All the activities will be accompanied by a visit and will be carried out within the same premises.

The visits are conceived as a dialogue between the visitors and the guide/monitor, who will introduce them to the environment of Villa Antiopa in a playful and fun way, accompanying them on a tour of the site where they are the protagonists. In order to do this, different educational methodologies will be used to enhance the users' intellectual and social skills, as well as the development of positive attitudes towards our heritage.

The General Attitudinal Objectives will be:

- To teach to value and respect for the cultural heritage, raising awareness of the importance of the archaeological site of Villa Antiopa and the Roman past of this complex, located in the municipality of Rincón de la Victoria.
- To transmit research, conservation, education and leisure activities.
- To promote teamwork, reflection and dialogue, valuing the opinions of others.
- To encourage curiosity as a starting point for the desire to learn.

Methodological strategies

- Participative-directive: active participation by the group led by the guide.
- Expository: where the guide will be the mediating agent to ensure that receptive learning is significant.
- Enquiry: the guide allows participants to work on content through their own action and reflection. They will be able to identify problems, their causes, obtain data, analyse them, compare them and draw conclusions and generalise them, always with the support of the guide/monitor.

Evaluation

At Eulenart we believe that a quality evaluation must be fed, on the one hand, by the evaluation of the visiting group and on the other hand, thanks to the control part that the professionals play.

The evaluation of the participant group will be carried out through:

- Direct observation by the monitors.

- Interventions produced during the visit, participation and attitude.
- Visitors' questionnaire: to be completed after the visit. *See annex
- Observation questionnaire, to be filled in by the monitor who has conducted the visit/workshop *See annex

● The evaluation of the control report will give us the necessary information to control the service at the level of:

- Number of staff per visit/day.
- Number of participants per visit/day.
- Degree of satisfaction of the participants.
- Degree of achievement of general and specific objectives.
- Incidents occurring in the service.

*The evaluation of the activities will be carried out by means of surveys according to the model of the EAPI questionnaires (Evaluation of Activities for Intergenerational Audiences) from the Ministry of Culture and Sport.

2. PROPOSALS FOR ACTIVITIES.

2.1 REGULAR VISITS.

The archaeological site of Villa Antiopa is one of the greatest discoveries of the late Roman Empire in the province of Malaga. Its knowledge and visit will allow us into the Roman society of the 3rd century, at the time of the change of era towards Christianity. Through its rooms, we will discover the modus vivendi of the people who lived in this Roman villae populated with mosaics next to the sea: customs, religion, politics, industry, gastronomy, etc. A walk through a past that will make us question, reflect and discover the influence of ancient Rome based on our current tastes and customs.

The visits will be of a regular nature and will start on the 1st of July. They take place from Tuesday to Sunday in the mornings from 12:00h to 13:00h, and in the afternoon from 17:00h to 17:00h in winter timetable. In the summer it will be from 12:00h to 13:00h and from 18:00h to 19:00h. They have a maximum capacity of 20 people.

Visitors to the Villa Romana de Antiopa can register directly at the site's reception desk at the site when purchasing their tickets. The Visitor Management staff will inform visitors of the existence of this service, informing them of the starting time and point of departure.

2.2 SCHOOL VISITS.

We propose an educational offer based on knowledge of the Roman Empire and the curricula of the different stages of the Roman Empire. The educational project will be varied and dynamic, taking into account the historical, artistic, cultural and botanical values of Villa Antiopa. It will cover all areas of knowledge, showing all areas of the site and archaeological remains on display.
